Student ambassadors represent the University of Exeter and work with staff in the Student Recruitment Office to support recruitment and widening participation events.

Examples of work available:

- Working at university open days and offer-holder visit days
- Manning stands or giving talks at information fairs in schools and colleges across the country
- Supporting the delivery of workshops for young people aged 13-18
- Mentoring young people in local schools regarding higher education
- Working as an AccessAbility and Wellbeing ambassador
- Providing subject tutoring for young people in local schools
- Running campus tours
- Working on residentials
- There may also be the opportunity to work directly for your university school/college on subject-related events

Hours: Work is available for student ambassadors throughout the year. Student Ambassadors can put their name forward for as much or as little work as they feel able to commit to around their studies; but they are expected to commit to work on a regular basis.

Pay: £7.85 per hour. All travel costs and time are covered.

Why get involved?

- feel positive about higher education (at the University of Exeter in particular) and want to share your experiences with others
- like to work with young people and recognise that they might need help in making important decisions
- want work that will enhance your communication and interpersonal skills, increasing your employability
