Anishinaabe Citizenships Through the Lens of Adoption Stories

However, adoption has become a controversial term, as settler society has weaponized it against Indigenous communities. In his talk, Dr Damien Lee explores the nation-making role of Anishinaabe (Ojibwa) adoption practices, highlighting key principles that have shaped citizenship both historically and in contemporary contexts.
