



Transformative Leadership in our new Green Economy

6 – 7 February 2025 Bedruthan Hotel, Cornwall

Two-day residential intensive training programme Funded through the *UK Shared Prosperity Fund*

Delivered by the University of Exeter in Cornwall under 'The Future is Green' project, this UK Shared Prosperity Funded two-day in person residential at the Bedruthan Hotel in Newquay, explored the transformative leadership skills needed to enable Cornwall and the Isles of Scilly to harness the opportunities, and face the challenges, of the new eco-industrial energy revolution towards the future green economy.

Examining strategic regional sectors including clean energy, power and construction; the aim of this delivery was the incubation of skills for visionary, diverse and inclusive leaders of the future to effectively lead sectorial economic activity towards a carbon neutral future in our region.

Individuals in Cornwall working on offshore wind, onshore solar, heating, engineering, planning and construction were specifically invited to join a cohort of 25 delegates. We specifically selected individuals who demonstrate either current, or potential leadership skills. We also aimed to represent diversity across attendees, including a balance of gender, age, background and career stage, aiming to facilitate highly valuable diverse and supportive new networks and connections. When asked to outline why they wished to attend this event, delegates said:









"I'm incredibly passionate about helping Cornwall to secure a just transition through the growth of the Cornish supply chain and local skills, for floating offshore wind and see it as one of the biggest opportunities to help clear a positive impact in the region."

"As a Cornish environmental scientist and business leader I'm excited about the opportunities offered by further renewable 'green' energy development in Cornwall. I'd like to bring my expertise in ecology, landscape, planning and renewables to work with and learn from a group of likeminded people."

"Working in sustainability within the mining industry, which is a heavily male dominated industry, I am very keen to upskill myself and develop my leadership skills. By attending this training I would hope to learn new ways of approaching leadership and overcoming challenges, and also to expand my network of people within the renewable energy space in Cornwall."

"As a female engineer, I have witnessed the industry's evolution and the increasing push toward sustainability and diversity. Attending the Transformative Leadership in Our New Green Economy training aligns with my commitment to driving meaningful change in the engineering sector."

"I work in the technical team for a developer of offshore wind projects... I am still at the early stages of my career and recognise that I have much more to learn. Having often found myself in male-dominated spaces... I am particularly keen to inspire and support women and other underrepresented groups to enter and thrive in the renewable energy sector and make a tangible difference in achieving a sustainable future. The programme's focus on diverse and sustainable leadership aligns perfectly with my ambition to grow as an effective leader who empowers others to join and succeed in the renewable energy sector."

The event was supported by four inspiring guest speakers from related industry, including Chris Coonick (*National Grid*), Kerry Hayes (*Simply Blue Group*), Steve Berry (*Kensa*) and Amanda Forman (*Planet A Solutions*). They spoke of their own career journeys, provided insights into their company's leadership practices and their own personal approach to inclusive and effective transformative leadership within their related sectors.

A series of workshops, supported by academics from the *University of Exeter Business School* (Allen Alexander, Ruth Cherrington, Hollie Kirk) further explored transformative leadership skills, including innovative net-walking sessions, exploratory *LEGO® SERIOUS PLAY®* workshops, communication style debating activities, and from *Planet A CIC*, an Ikigai three stands of purpose workshop.
