### HONOURABLE MENTIONS

Here are some of the bookshops that we didn't have the time to tell you about, but we think are well worth your attention.

### **CORNWALL**

**The Edge of the World Bookshop** - Located in Penzance, this quirky bookshop sells a variety of books including classics, local Cornish picks and novelties.

**Beerwolf Books** - Both a pub and a bookshop in one, Beerwolf Books in Falmouth offers the best of both worlds!

**Falmouth Bookseller** - Tied with the Padstow and St Ives Booksellers, this shop owned by Mabecron Books stocks a range of books including several Cornish and South West-inspired publications.

### **DEVON**

**Curious Otter Bookshop** - Based in Ottery St Mary, the birthplace of early nineteenth-century poet Samuel Taylor Coleridge, this bookshop offers books on local interests such as history and wildlife, alongside a large children's section.

**Liznojan** - This bookshop in Tiverton boasts a coffee shop, a Tolkien-inspired therapy room and an events space, and was opened by a mother and daughter team.

**Paragon Books** - Sidmouth's oldest independent bookshop. Their small team regularly selects a book of the month and holds frequent events, including author signings and late-night shopping.

### **BATH**

**Mr. B's Emporium of Reading Delights** - This beautiful bookshop in the heart of Bath is a paradise for any book lover. Opened in 2006, Mr. B's Emporium has continued to stay true to its name, delighting readers with their favourite books. **Topping & Company Booksellers** - This family-run independent bookshop is one of the biggest independent bookshops in England, reaching over two floors and a gallery. It hosts regular author events and an Autumn Literary Festival every year.

### **BRISTOL**

**Excelsior! Comics** - This independent comic book shop on Bond Street in the heart of Bristol is run by comic enthusiasts for anyone interested in comics. The shop also stocks a wide array of board games.

**Gloucester Road Books** - Opened in 2021, Gloucester Road Books offers a wide variety of titles with particular attention drawn to books by small independent publishers.

**The Last Bookshop** - This bookshop, where you get books for the dream price of  $\pounds 3$ , began with the aim of regulating the huge amount of waste created by the publishing industry.
